NBCF funds breast cancer research to prevent, **detect**, stop and treat this disease – research that ultimately saves lives.


Did you know?

Breast cancer is the most common cancer among women, with 1 in 7 women in Australia diagnosed with breast cancer in their lifetime. The earlier breast cancer is found, the greater the chance of survival – early detection is one of the most powerful approaches available to end deaths from breast cancer.

MEET THE RESEARCHER:

NBCF-funded researcher Dr Luke Marinovich from the University of Sydney aims to advance breast cancer screening with the use of two new technologies: artificial intelligence (AI) and digital breast tomosynthesis (3-dimensional imaging).

“For women attending screening, it is hoped that AI will help to identify more cancers that would otherwise progress to become life-threatening. By allowing earlier treatment of these cancers, this will ultimately further reduce deaths from breast cancer.”
