Through precision prevention research, we're not just focused on treating breast cancer – we're working to prevent it entirely.



MEET THE RESEARCHER:

NBCF-funded researcher Professor Paul James from the University of Melbourne aims to reveal how genetic variants function collectively to modify breast cancer risk.
