Did you know?

The number of people dying from breast cancer in Australia continues to increase, and there are no consistently effective treatments for some hard-to-treat and metastatic breast cancers.

Developing new treatments, repurposing or improving current treatments, and testing ways to combine existing treatments are vital for NBCF to achieve our vision of Zero Deaths from breast cancer.

MEET THE RESEARCHER:

NBCF-funded researcher Professor Paul Beavis from the Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre aims to make immunotherapy more effective for people living with Triple Negative Breast Cancer (TNBC).

“We hope that by improving the ability of immune cells to infiltrate the tumours, we can increase the proportion of patients that benefit from this type of therapy. Immunotherapy has a favourable side effect profile relative to chemotherapy and therefore can significantly improve the quality of a patient's life after therapy when it is effective.”
